

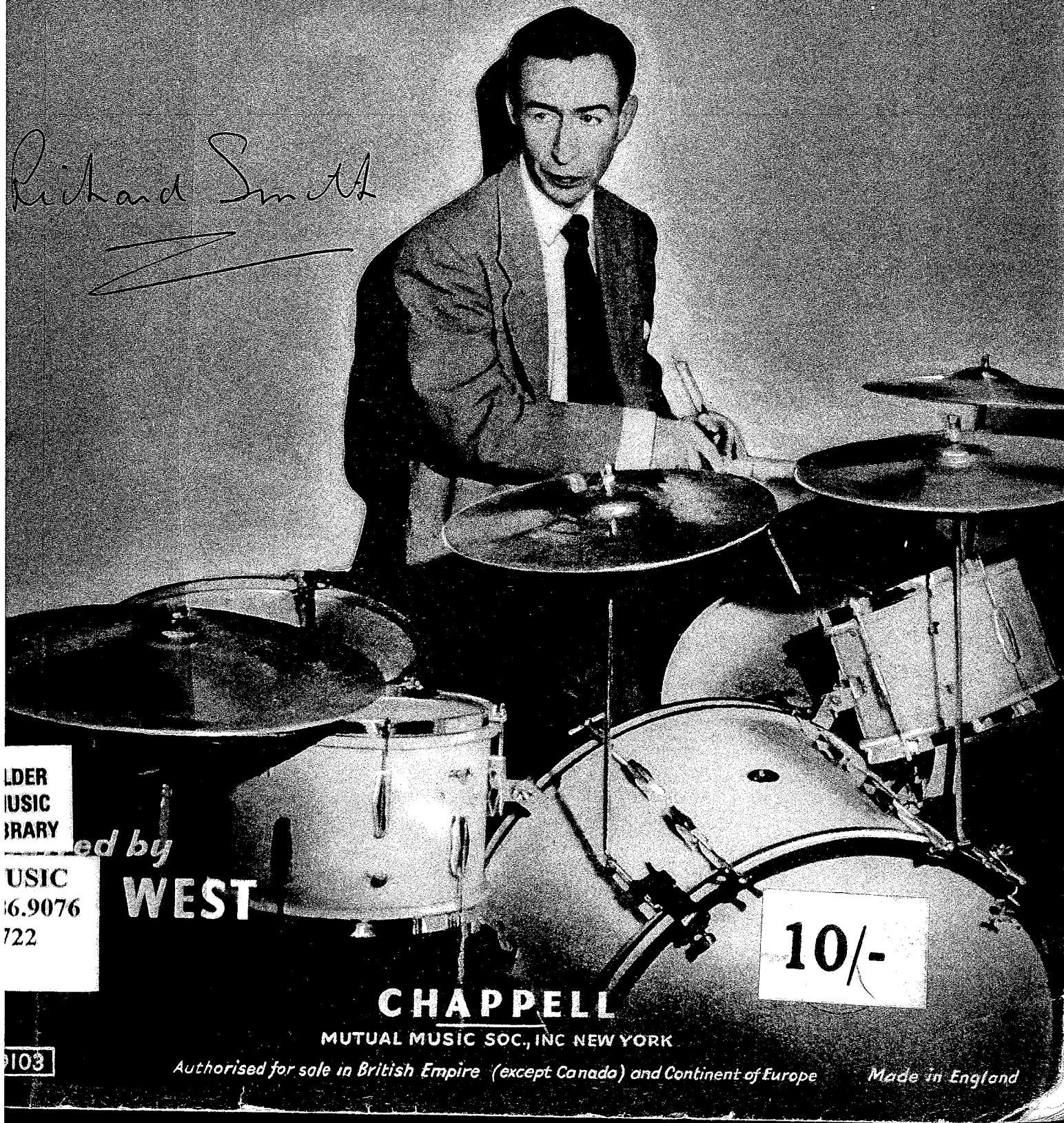

..... DAVE TOUGH attended high school in Oak Park, Illinois, his birthplace, and later attended Lewis Institute in Chicago, where, after meeting Jimmy MacPartland, he joined The Blue Friars. In 1928, he toured Europe with Danny Polo, and created a sensation among the Europeans. Joined Tommy Dorsey in 1935 and remained with him until 1938, at which time he joined Benny Goodman's Orchestra, replacing Gene Krupa. From 1939 to 1942, Dave Tough appeared with the orchestras of Bunny Berigan, Jack Teagarden, Joe Marsala, Artie Shaw, Charlie Spivak, and Woody Herman. Joined the Navy in 1942 and played with Artie Shaw's Navy Orchestra, and after his discharge from the Navy, re-joined the Woody Herman Orchestra until October 1945. In the early part of 1946, he played with Jerry Gray's N.B.C. Philip Morris Orchestra.

Dave Tough for many years has been known as the "musicians' drummer", whose dynamic "beat" has proved to be an inspiration to and greatly responsible for the success of the many orchestras with whom he has played. He distinguished himself by winning the 1946 Down Beat, Metronome and Esquire Magazine awards as the most outstanding swing drummer — the first drummer ever to win all three awards in one year.
